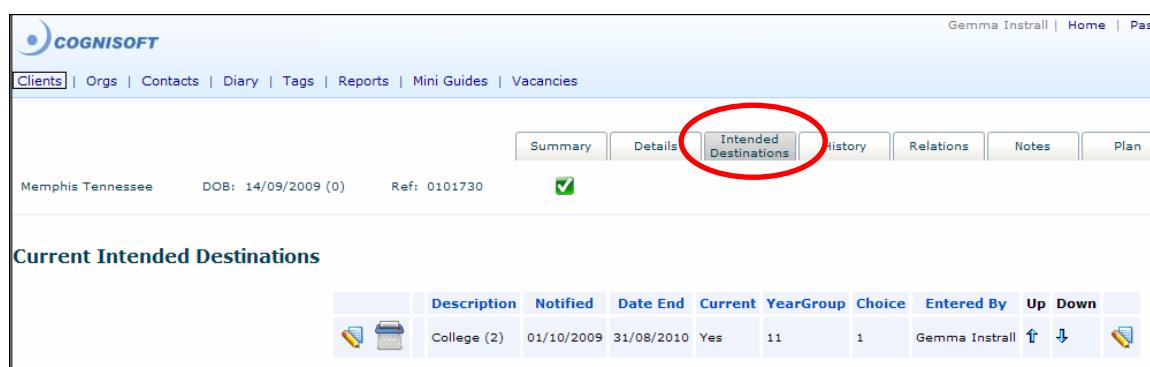


Intended Destinations Definitions

One of the most important pieces of information that we have to report to the DCSF on a monthly basis is the **Intended Destination** of the young person. This is because, as PA's, we are aiming to assist young people in effective transitions at key times in their lives. We need an awareness of what their future plans are so that we can provide effective advice and guidance to make sure that they have the necessary information and support needed to achieve their goals.

On IO Insight, the **Intended Destination** information appears in the **Client** record under the **Intended Destination** tab (circled below in red):



A description of how to enter an **Intended Destination** for a young person is described in the **IO102_Intended Destinations mini guide.pdf**.

The descriptions in the table below are intended to act as a guide to what each of the **Intended Destination** types mean. It is abridged from the CCIS Requirement 2008-9 document produced by the DCSF. A full copy of the document can be obtained on request from the Information Team.

DCSF Description	How It Appears in IO	Description
Staying in same school	Staying in same school	The young person is intending to continue on in post compulsory education in the same school that they attended in Year 11.
Other school	Other school	As above, but at a school different to the one that they attended in Year 11.

Gap Year Student	Gap Year	The young person has a definite place at a Higher Education establishment but has chosen to defer entry into higher education
Training / Apprenticeship - definite place	Training / Apprenticeship - definite place	The young person is intending to enter the labour market after completion of Year 11 and they have a definite offer of an LSC funded training place.
Training / Apprenticeship - no definite place	Training / Apprenticeship - no definite place	The young person is intending to enter the labour market after completion of Year 11 but does not yet have a definite offer of an LSC funded training place.
Labour Market - definite place	Labour Market - definite place	The young person is intending to enter the labour market and has a definite offer to start work on completion of Year 11.
Labour Market - no definite place	Labour Market - no definite place	As above but the young person does not have a definite offer to start work on completion of Year 11.
Undecided	Undecided	The young person has not made any firm decisions about where they want to be on completion of Year 11. You should only use this category where the young person is wholly undecided and they are considering a range of different options.
Other	Other	This should only be used for a destination that does not appear in any of the above descriptions. An example of this might be voluntary work.
Not obtained	Not obtained	This is used only where a destination hasn't been obtained from the young person. It is important that Year 11 leavers have an intended destination recorded for them. Services will be monitored on the numbers of young

		people reported without a destination.
College	College	For young people who are intending to continue on in post compulsory education at a college.

Recording **Intended Destination** is a mandatory requirement and they need to be filled in for all the young people that you register on IO.
